A Message from Erica Dunmow of CTSY, who writes as follows:

Dear Friends,

This feels like an exciting time for many of the Together and Gather Groups across the county and England in general, with a wider range of church traditions getting together in different ways for mission than ever before.

At various points I've had conversations with you all (from Christians Together in Barnsley, City Vision Rotherham and Churches Together in Rotherham, Mission Doncaster and emPower Sheffield) about how to best involve as wide a spread of Christian pastors as possible in the various groups that are focussed on mission in the four towns of South Yorkshire.

In those conversations, you all were finding similar issues about creating a welcome for Christians of different traditions - things like relational /friendship networks vs formal structures, the difficulty of keeping momentum going over time and the balance of prayer vs conversation vs business etc. These are all issues that face me in my work too, and I found the conversations really helpful and learnt from you all in what you're doing.

So I'm offering to set up a **roundtable meeting** over afternoon tea (2.30-4.00pm) at **The Ibis Rotherham East**, MOORHEAD WAY, BRAMLEY, ROTHERHAM, S66 1YY (It's just off A630 Bawtry Rd out of Rotherham, very near to J1 of M18, so reasonably easy for us all to reach).

The **purpose** would be to meet each other if we've not already done so, and to share a little about how our groups work and how we've tried to keep an open forum in our different groups, and see where that takes us.

Also, Musa and Nike are looking to get a broad-based prayer/relational network going again in Sheffield and provide a mission focus that's been lacking in the last few years in the city, (I've been supporting that) and it would be great to learn from those who've been doing it longer!

Emma, who does some meeting support administration for CTSY, will be contacting you with a Doodle poll when she's back from her holiday after 15th May to set up a date for late May, early June.

I look forward to meeting with you all soon.

We are living in great and incredible days!

The sense of expectation and excitement across many of the churches in Rotherham is truly amazing.

"I am constantly hearing stories of growth, a renewed vibrancy and many churches reaching their capacity on Sundays, with standing room only. Some churches are going to double servicing, or are finding bigger buildings.

"What amazes me is that this is not just one church in Rotherham doing well, but it is THE CHURCH in Rotherham doing well," writes Pastor Adrian Dexter.

He adds, "Many leaders and intercessors have been meeting together to pray for all our Churches for a few years now, and whilst I accept that "United Prayer" is not the only reason why we are seeing such consistent across the board growth, I do believe it is a significant part of what God is doing to change the spiritual climate so that there may be a great openness to the Gospel.

"A few years ago God gave me a commission and a mandate: 'gather those who have heard the call, to pray for a revival in the Church and an awakening in the Nation'.

"We are praying that a "rising tide will lift all boats" and we are going to continue to push through in United Prayer until we see the fullness of what God is wanting to do in darkest Rotherham.

"We are continuing our monthly united prayer events on the '-teenth Friday of every month' starting at LIBERTY Church, S60 1JH from 8.00pm until late. The next event is on the sixteenth of May (On the seventeenth of October we are running a 24-hour prayer event in Sheffield --- see the FOOTNOTE below for more information about this event. ***).

"The evening will be called **IGNITE** and will be focussed on Prayer, Worship, Intercession and Prophecy, and we will be picking up on some of the "Harp and Bowl" strategies from **IHOP** (International House of Prayer)

"If you would like to host an **IGNITE** evening, please let me know.

"If you cannot make it," concludes Adrian, "please be aware that we will be battling and praying for your church to see increase and blessing in every area. Remember, there is a session on the Friday of each month when the date is anywhere between the 13th and the 19th. "

NEWS FROM ANOTHER DEXTER AT LIBERTY CHURCH, but he's not related by blood to Adrian! He's from the United States, thus adding to the cosmopolitan and international nature of our town

"My name is *Emmanuel Dexter* and I am the **Youth Pastor** at *Liberty Church* here in Rotherham (formerly RPC). I am contacting you all because I am organizing a Youth event called "*The Pulse*" for Friday June 6th at 8pm.

"I know that in the past *Unite* provided a large meeting where our youth groups could come and relate to each other, but now we don't really have that. **My goal is to establish a youth event that takes place every other month where young people and youth leaders from the community can come together and grow together through encountering Jesus.**

"The event will be inspirational for the Christian youth who are already a part of a youth group or Church, and evangelistic for their unsaved friends. It is my hope and prayer that we see young people saved and ALL of our youth groups growing. That is the aim of this event. It would be so good to have you come along and bring some young people with you, if that is possible."

NEW COURSES FOR LEADERS OF YOUNG PEOPLE

Jonathan Buckley of the White Rose YMCA and Mike North, the Youth and Children's Deveopment Officer for the Sheffield Anglican Diocese, are starting to advertise the second intake of the 'Aurora Youth Ministry' and 'Aurora Children's Ministry' courses which will run from September.

Aimed at volunteer youth and children's workers in the local church, these courses are designed to meet the needs of volunteer youth and children's leaders and workers who have busy lives and no formal qualifications. It is a ten-month course run by the YMCA, Sheffield Diocese and Cliff College. It costs £200 (bursaries are available) and students can gain a Level 3 or 4 Cliff College Certificate in Youth or Children's Ministry, and a Bishops Certificate in Youth or Children's Ministry at levels 2, 3 or 4.
