NEW COURSES FOR LEADERS OF YOUNG PEOPLE

Jonathan Buckley of the White Rose YMCA and Mike North, the Youth and Children's Development Officer for the Sheffield Anglican Diocese, are advertising the second intake of the 'Aurora Youth Ministry' and 'Aurora Children's Ministry' courses which will run from September 2014.

Aimed at volunteer youth and children's workers in the local church, these courses are designed to meet the needs of volunteer youth and children's leaders and workers who have busy lives and no formal qualifications. It is a ten-month course run by the YMCA, Sheffield Diocese and Cliff College. It costs £200 (bursaries are available) and students can gain a Level 3 or 4 Cliff College Certificate in Youth or Children's Ministry, and a Bishop's Certificate in Youth or Children's Ministry at levels 2, 3 or 4.

The 31st of August 2014 marks the retirement of *Rev Vernon Marsh*, Chairman of the Sheffield Methodist District, the former Circuit Superintendent Minister in Rotherham and a former President of Churches Together in Rotherham.

Those who were able to attend Vernon's retirement service at the Firth Park Methodist Church in Sheffield on Wednesday 16th July were able to take part in a very special act of worship to mark the tremendous contribution he has made to Methodism, to Christianity generally and also to Interfaith matters in our area.

Vernon will certainly be in our prayers as he and his wife Meg move to pastures new across the Pennines.

Vernon's successor to lead Methodism in the geographically large Sheffield District will be a lady minister, *Rev Gill Newton*. Her welcome service will take place at *Talbot Lane Methodist Church* in Rotherham town centre on *Sunday 31st August at 4.00 pm*. Talbot Lane is a large church with more seating than anywhere else in Rotherham, so if anyone at all would like to attend there will be room to seat you. You don't have to be a Methodist to welcome a new leader to the District --- all are welcome.
